BGAV 2020 Spiritual Care Training Event Course Descriptions

Baptist Distinctives (16-hour course)

This course provides crucial instruction to bear in this core curriculum of the Spiritual Care Training Event. Chaplains must know what they believe and why, what it means to be Texas and Virginia Baptist and how best to represent our churches in their institution.

Seminarians, CPE students, and Chaplain Candidates must attend this course before receiving Full Endorsement from the Baptist General Convention of Texas and the BGAV.

Peer Support for First Responders (16-hour Course)

After completing the training, students will have the necessary knowledge and skills to provide support to their peers, have a basic understanding of common behavioral health issues affecting the first responders, can serve as a bridge to community resources or behavioral health treatment when indicated, and are able to build or enhance their peer support programs.

Coaching for Pastors and Chaplains (16-hour course)

This course will help practitioners learn the distinctives of Christian coaching, how coaching is different from other ministry practices, the basic six skills of coaching, the core competencies of coaching, and conversational models for a coaching conversation. Students will practice coaching skills and conversations with other participants.

Introduction to Intentional Interim Ministry (16-hour course)

This training helps ministers in traditional interim setting do more than simply supply the pulpit. It is designed to help an Interim Pastor assist a church with common issues that impact the search for its next pastor

Correctional Chaplaincy (16-hour course)

This comprehensive course provides State Correctional Chaplains a forum for discussion and learning about various topics to help them minister to their inmates and officers. Topics include managing chapel funds, fund-raising, balancing inmate and officer relationships, and more!

Art of Facilitating a Learning Event (Two 8 hour courses)
