### Texas A&M Kingsville BSM Texas

At Texas A&M University-Kingsville, the Baptist Student Ministry (BSM) is actively reaching out to students and ministering to them in a variety of ways. Each week, the BSM hosts a free lunch for students where they share the Gospel with those who attend. The BSM serves over 4,000 free meals to students every year.

For the past few years, the BSM also has been handing out free peanut butter and jelly sandwiches in the quad during an outreach they call PEAS, which stands for prayer, encouragement and sandwiches. PEAS often leads to conversations with students on campus, and those who stop by are invited to small group Bible study and Thursday night worship service. Through these outreach efforts, 35 students have been led to follow Christ in the last year.

BSM Director Joe Luna is very excited to help young adults discern the call to ministry in their own lives. He shared about two sophomores who expressed an interest in full-time ministry, one of whom wants to become a BSM director.

This is one of 114 Texas BSMs ministering to college students.
