- \$23 million goes to support more than 3,000 missionaries worldwide
- 9,000+ Go Now student missionaries were sent since 1946

BY TRAINING MINISTERS

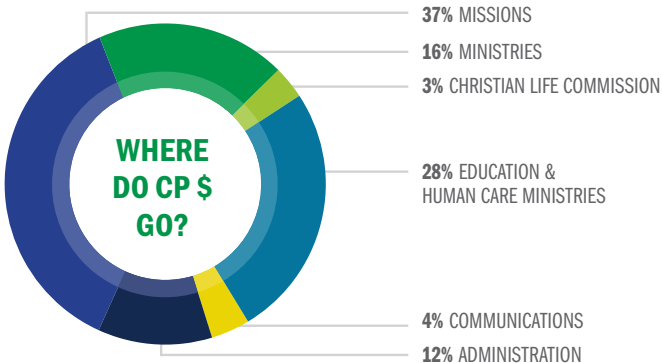
- 1,200+ undergraduate ministry students at 9 Texas Baptist universities receive ministry scholarships
- 7,700+ graduate students across 13 Texas Baptist universities and seminaries and 6 SBC seminaries receive 50% tuition scholarships
- 14,000+ church leaders receive training in Evangelism, Discipleship, and Music & Worship annually

BY SHARING THE GOSPEL WITH STUDENTS

- 124,165 college students were impacted on 144 Texas campuses through Baptist Student Ministries (BSMs)
- 35,882 spiritual conversations resulted in 462 new believers through BSM in 2018

BY PROVIDING CARE TO THOSE IN NEED

- 372,566 spiritual conversations took place through the work of chaplains at 4 Texas Baptist hospitals in 2018
- 165,456 of Texas' most vulnerable were served through 4 Texas Baptist Child and Family Care institutions
